Smithfield Foods Donates More Than 44,000 Pounds of Protein to the San Antonio Food Bank

San Antonio, Tx. – June 15, 2018 – Smithfield Foods, Inc. and H-E-B joined forces to donate more than 44,000 pounds of protein to the San Antonio Food Bank.
